9:30am.

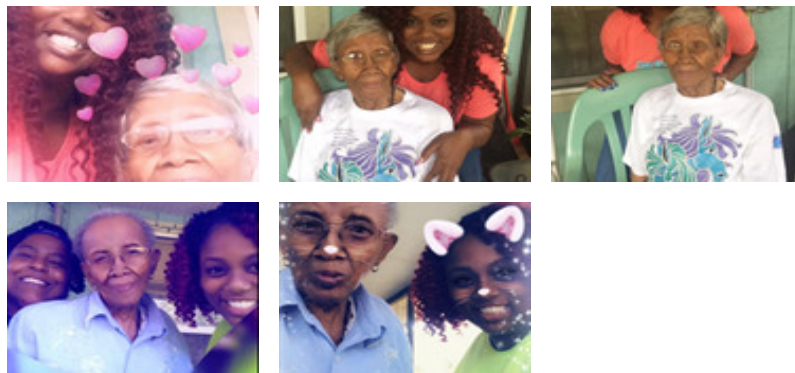
