She served on the Barbara Higgins scholarship committee; Board of Director for Family Christian Association of America, Miami, Fl., President and CEO of Gainesville Family Community Outreach, Inc.; nominated for the Community Spirit Award for work with the Phoenix Apartment residents as director of BLM.
